# 80V N-Channel PowerTrench® MOSFET

### **General Description**

This N-Channel MOSFET has been designed specifically to improve the overall efficiency of DC/DC converters using either synchronous or conventional switching PWM controllers.


These MOSFETs feature faster switching and lower gate charge than other MOSFETs with comparable  $R_{\text{DS(ON)}}$  specifications.

The result is a MOSFET that is easy and safer to drive (even at very high frequencies), and DC/DC power supply designs with higher overall efficiency.

#### Notes

1. R<sub>eJA</sub> is the sum of the junction-to-case and case-to-ambient thermal resistance where the case thermal reference is defined as the solder mounting surface of the drain pins. R<sub>eJC</sub> is guaranteed by design while R<sub>eCA</sub> is determined by the user's board design.




Figure 1. On-Region Characteristics.




Figure 3. On-Resistance Variation with Temperature.




Figure 5. Transfer Characteristics.




Figure 2. On-Resistance Variation with Drain Current and Gate Voltage.




Figure 4. On-Resistance Variation with Gate-to-Source Voltage.





Figure 6. Body Diode Forward Voltage Variation with Source Current and Temperature.




Figure 7. Gate Charge Characteristics.





Figure 8. Capacitance Characteristics.






Figure 9. Maximum Safe Operating Area.

Figure 10. Single Pulse Maximum Power Dissipation.




Figure 11. Transient Thermal Response Curve.
